#### **Course Policies**

This course will be delivered in-person in the Large Animal Auditorium to a group of students on a rotating basis. Faculty who are lecturing in the classroom will be required to wear a mask. The members of the class who are not physically present in the classroom will be attending the live synchronous lecture via Zoom. The group of students who attend physically each day will follow physical distancing and masking requirements. Eating or drinking while in the classroom during lecture is prohibited.

Additional guidelines for online learning and face-to-face learning are detailed below:

#### **Online Learning Policies:**

The College of Veterinary Medicine asks that students, when possible, have cameras turned on for courses in the professional curriculum, which facilitates participation and professional communication. Our class sessions may be audio visually recorded for students in the class to refer back and for enrolled students who are unable to attend live. Students who participate with their camera engaged or utilize a profile image are agreeing to have their video or image recorded. If you are unwilling to consent to have your profile or video image recorded, be sure to keep your camera off and do not use a profile image. Likewise, students who un-mute during class and participate orally are agreeing to have their voices recorded. The chat will not be recorded or shared. As in all courses, unauthorized recording and unauthorized sharing of recorded materials is prohibited.
